# GOLDEN SQUARE ONE WAY SYSTEM

At its February Town Council meeting, councillors considered revised plans from KCC, for the implementation of the One-Way System at Golden Square. The scheme, in addition includes a speed reduction to 20 miles per hour and installation of a raised table on Oaks Road. Final scheme cost currently stands at £25,400. Timings for implementation are to be confirmed, but it is hoped that the scheme will be delivered in the autumn of 2024.

# POTHOLE & ROAD MAINTENANCE

Recognising that the state of roads in and around the town is of considerable concern to residents, town councillors agreed (with support of KCC Councillor, Mike Hill) to invite representatives of Kent County Council to attend the March town council meeting to discuss and take questions regarding potholes and road maintenance in the town. The session is an opportunity for councillors and the public to gain a better understanding of the current highways situation and put across their concerns regarding the state of Tenterden roads.

# TENTERDEN NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Tenterden Neighbourhood Plan is currently at the independent examination stage. Further updates will be posted on the town council website as they are available.


## TOWN COUNCIL SETS A BUDGET FOR 2024/2025

# 6.15% increase in the town council precept for 2024/2025.

In December, the Town Council considered and approved its budget and precept for the financial year 2024/2025. The 'precept' is the town council's share of council tax collected by Ashford Borough Council. The town council does not receive funding directly from central government and relies on the precept and income generated from chargeable services and facilities, to fund its activities and amenities.

The budget for 2024/2025 was set at £724,250. Income for the year has been estimated at £30,470. The precept for the parish of Tenterden for 2024/25 was set at £693,750 (compared with £653,580 in 2023/2024).

#### ■ About your **Council Tax**


Council tax is a local tax that you pay to fund the services that are provided by:


- Ashford Borough Council
- Kent County Council
- Kent Police and Crime Commissioner
- Kent Fire and Rescue Services
- Tenterden Town Council

This represents an increase of 6.15%.
For Band D households, this amounts to £176.13 for the Tenterden parish element of annual council tax for the 2024/25 year, compared to £167.97 per year in 2023/24. The monthly cost of the precept to a Band D resident, amounts to £14.

An ambitious project to deliver desperately needed improvements to the historic Town Hall.

The Grade II listed building which occupies a prominent position on Tenterden High Street, will undergo extensive renovation (starting in 2024), to achieve a sustainable, community-based building, which is both welcoming and accessible to all, whilst addressing issues arising from the declining state of the building.

These renovations are essential to both preserve and maintain

the Town Hall for future users. The building is currently extremely challenging to use, manage and maintain. Issues include unacceptable levels of humidity, mould, excessive rising damp, regular sewage smells and water ingress to offices and communal areas.


In January 2024, the archaic and inefficient heating system failed, resulting in users resorting to electric heaters to heat individual rooms, while communal and other spaces remain bitterly cold and unusable.

Temperatures in the building are worsened through the lack of insulation and the poorly fitting windows and doors.

All in all, the Town Hall is no longer fit for use by the town council or the community and has now closed pending the start of the renovation project. This ambitious restoration project will preserve and protect the Town Hall and restore it as a welcoming, vibrant and fit for purpose building while maintaining and enhancing its historical features. It is anticipated that the building will be closed for 2 years.

## **NEWLY FORMED VISTRY HOMES** (TENTERDEN) STEERING COMMITTEE

On 7th November 2023, representatives of the Town Council met with Vistry Homes and their associates, Ashford Borough Council Officers and Councillors, and members of the Town Council's Tenterden Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee and Climate Action Group. This pre-application meeting was to review Vistry Homes' proposed Reserved Matters documentation for the land between Appledore Road and Woodchurch Road development (referred to by many as Limes Land). At this useful meeting, Vistry Homes were amenable to the creation of a Steering Committee to keep the lines of communication open between all parties as their application progresses through to completion of the development.

The first meeting of the Steering Committee took place on Friday, 26th January 2024 and it is intended that the Committee will meet approximately once per month. As well as those organisations stated above, representatives from Kent County Council, the Tenterden Community Land Trust and Limes Land Protection Group were also present.

The Town Council were keen for the Steering Committee to be set up, given the success of the Steering Committee that was set up for the Tent1 development which is known to residents as Church View and Three Fields. As many will know, the original Wates Planning Application was permitted through Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate; Vistry Homes who are working in conjunction with Wates will see the development through to completion.

# **TENTERDEN RECREATION GROUND PROJECT**

An ambitious project to deliver much needed improvements to the Tenterden Recreation Ground.

The Town Council recognises its importance to the community and seeks to deliver improved facilities for to this much-loved park.

Planned improvements to the park include new and refurbished play equipment in the children's play area; a new and improved toddler zone, with nearby picnic and seating area and a skate or pump park with youth hub alongside. Proposed courts for tennis and netball are included in the plans. In addition, the scheme will incorporate a much-needed drainage strategy, alongside improved planting, updated toilet facilities and an enhanced workzone for maintenance purposes. As well as improving the facilities, priorities for delivery include taking opportunities to promote and provide additional ecological and amenity benefits.

The town council will deliver in manageable stages through a phased approach. This strategy facilitates careful budgeting, enables independent completion of specific sections, and minimises disruptions during the renovation. Crucially, this approach will allow the town council to press ahead with improvements. Plans to remove the football pitch and install tennis and netball courts at the far end of the site cannot be delivered until there is suitable alternative provision for Tenterden football teams elsewhere in the town and permission is obtained for removal. Provision of the additional pitches at Appledore Road will enable the town council to approach both ABC and Sport England to request review of the need for the Tenterden Recreation Ground football pitch,



taking into account the increased level of facilities available in the town. The council recognises that the Appledore Road pitches are intended as replacement for the Homewood school pitch and cannot be seen as replacement provision for that at the Recreation Ground. In the interim period, the council can deliver much needed improvements to the remainder of the park.

The town council has however recently agreed that details of the scheme and associated costs be reviewed to allow a more affordable scheme to be achieved. Cost savings are achievable by for example, maintaining the children's play area in its current location,

retaining the mound (incorporating and enhancing its role as an existing play feature) and through review of the proposed materials to be used.

The town council is working with Mark Hanton Studios (landscape architects) and Logic PM (project managers) to bring the plans to fruition. Where possible, improvements will be delivered through permitted development.
