TOWN HALL PROJECT

The Town Council's exciting plans to regenerate the Town Hall are steaming ahead, with contractors now on site.

Town Hall Renovations are focused on creating a first-class facility for our community to provide user-friendly and accessible spaces to host activities and events (whether for art, drama or music) and as a venue for club and society use. On re-opening, the Town Hall will continue to host weddings, making use of the Mayor's Parlour and Assembly Room as well as the new and welcoming downstairs reception and exhibition space. TENTERDEN WELCOMES THE NEW LORD WARDEN

On the 1st November, Tenterden Town Council was pleased to welcome the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, Admiral Sir George Zambellas along with Lady Zambellas and Flag Lieutenant Alex Firth.

Sir George who was installed as Lord Warden at a historic ceremony in Dover on 29th October 2024, visited Tenterden during his tour of all 14 Cinque Port Towns. Our thanks go to town historians, Cllr Jane Mills, Debbie Greaves, Naomi Dickins and Nick Hudd, as well as to Canon Rev Lindsay Hammond, Town Council Chaplain Rev Jeanette Kennett and the Rev Andrew Tapsell, for sharing your knowledge and passion for Tenterden, with Sir George and invited guests.

TENTERDEN RECREATION **GROUND** PROJECT

Delivering much needed improvements at the Tenterden Recreation Ground remains a priority for the Town Council.

In a welcome development, Sport England having reviewed the current Masterplan and phasing documentation, praised the scheme and indicated that they would not raise a statutory objection to a planning application if submitted on this basis. This news is significant as it allows the council to undertake necessary steps towards seeking planning approval for the project.

To deliver the project in its entirety, football teams will be relocated to new pitches being delivered as part of the Appledore Road development. Councillors met with Tenterden Town Football club representatives earlier in the year to discuss this arrangement, which is seen on both sides as an opportunity to secure vastly improved facilities for the town's footballers.

The town council is working with Mark Hanton Studios (landscape architects), Logic PM (project managers) and Price Whitehead (planning consultants) to bring the plans to fruition.

The Town Council is investing more than £10,000 in updating the infrastructure which powers the town's Christmas light displays to the trees on the High Street and at East Cross. As part of the lead up to Christmas, the Town Council's Christmas Lights will be lit up from 3.30pm on Friday, 22nd November. Due to the Town Hall refurbishment, there will not be an official light switch on this year, however, we hope you can still visit the Town to enjoy the display as well as visit our wonderful shops and businesses.

REPAIR IN **SCHOOLS**

We have partnered with Homewood School and Tenterden Junior School to enable a cohort of their students to learn the practical skills of repair and to bring to life curriculum topics in circuits and optics, energy generation and wireless communication.

Tenterden locals are soon to have an exciting new reward scheme, now that Tenterden Town Council has invited the TN card to support its town centre independents.

The TN card is run by Kent mum of four Jess Gibson, who created the TN card four years ago to encourage the communities of Tonbridge and Tunbridge Wells to support local. It's grown rapidly since then and now has over 900 businesses from across the TN postcodes in its directory - all thanking TN card members (card holders) for supporting local with exclusive treats. offers or discounts.

Businesses in Tenterden which have joined so far include Bespoke Butcher, Brunch and Brew, Ceci's Corner, Chapel Down, McCann's Tap Room, Raffman & Huckster, Sinden Theatre, The Lemon Tree and Tenterden Trout Waters, and more are being added to the TN card's Tenterden directory each week.

The TN card is a certified social enterprise and is a reward card

with a difference. Members can join for £3 a month or £25 a year and 10% from their purchase is donated to mental health charity Mind. Profits are directed into supporting and promoting its participating businesses, while members get to enjoy everything from free fizz when dining out to 10% off their shopping.

Jess says, "I launched the TN card because I'm passionate about seeing our High Streets thriving. In an online world, our independents are all about people, social connection and personal service, and supporting them is better for our planet too. Tenterden is an incredibly special town and I'm excited to now be working with many of its independents to reward locals for using them.

TENTERDEN BUSINESS E-PERMIT

Tenterden Business e-Permit allows a vehicle to park in Bridewell Lane car park and at the rear of the Leisure centre car park Monday to Saturday.

Tenterden Business e-Permit is valid for 12 months

Who can apply for an e-Permit? Tenterden Business e-Permit must be made by a business based or trading in the borough of Tenterden.

How much does an e-Permit Cost? £594.00 for 12 months

SEASON TICKETS AND CAR PARK VOUCHERS

Season tickets reduce the cost of parking if you frequently visit some of the council car parks. They allow one, three, six or 12 months of parking in advance in the relevant council car parks (Bridewell Lane Car Park and rear section of Leisure Centre Car Park).

Car Park Vouchers are a flexible way to reduce the cost of parking for a day if you use council car parks a less frequently. Virtual vouchers can be purchased in books of 10, are valid for one year and can be used in Bridewell Lane and the rear section of Leisure Centre Car Park. You'll need to open a secure, online account. To start a parking session simply log in to your account, add your vehicle registration number, choose the date and start time.

WAR MEMORIAL ADDITIONAL NAMES

The names of 12 individuals missing from the Tenterden War Memorial have now been inscribed on the memorial steps, to ensure their rightful place alongside those of other fallen Tenterden residents. This project which began as a result of extensive research undertaken by the late Carol Douglas, identified names of the fallen who were either born in or resident in Tenterden at the time of enlistment and who are not remembered on any other civic war memorial.
