# Tenterden Folk Festival 2024

Welcome to the 31st face to face Tenterden Folk Festival. It has been a very difficult year to organise as we have been faced with rising costs, more red tape and, most importantly, substantial cuts in funding from a couple of the local authorities and organisations who traditionally support us. The Town Hall is not available this year as it is closed for construction work which will end up making it into a valuable modern community building while retaining all its historic features. The Glebe Hall may or may not be available as it is due to be demolished to make way for more housing. We still have all our other regular venues and thank them for their vital support.

Despite all this we have pressed ahead with our planning and are very pleased with this year's guest list which includes some first time visitors to Tenterden, some young musicians you will not know, some nationally known folk singers, some returning guests and many of our regular local guests and supporters. You will find the full list later in the programme. Also check out the list of Morris sides and folk dance display teams which also includes some dancing at TFF for the first time. Most of our regular stallholders will be back on the Recreation Ground along with many new ones.

During the year we have held a couple of fundraising barn dances at Old Dairy Tap Room who supported us by donating the venue. The bands and callers waived their fees and local businesses donated raffle prizes, so all the proceeds have gone into the festival funds.

Your Festival

This year your festival starts on Thursday evening with The Around Kent Folk Concert featuring Bob Kenward, John & Di Cullen, Julie & Gavin Atkin, and Sue Watson. This will be a concert of songs written, collected or otherwise connected with Kent performed by popular Kent based musicians and singers. This event is not covered by the Full Weekend Tickets.

As usual the festival continues until late Sunday night with concerts, music and song sessions, workshops, meet the guest events, an English Barn Dance and many other events.

Despite difficult times financially for small festivals, we have put together what we consider to be an excellent guest list including several guests making their first appearances at Tenterden and others who are back by popular demand. We also have our usual core of regular and local guests who help to make the festival possible.

**Dance displays:** Dancers will take to the streets on Saturday and Sunday. The festival continues to attract Morris sides and dance display teams from across the country including regular teams who come back year after year, and exciting new ones. Dance styles will include Cotswold, Border, Molly, Clog, Garland, and contemporary, as well as Appalachian, Bulgarian, Slovakian and a few surprises.

Hopefully the wet spring and early summer will come to an end and the rain will stop and the sun will shine for the festival procession on Saturday. Starting from near the War Memorial in the High Street at 3:00 p.m. the procession will proceed through the town centre to finish on the Recreation Ground by the marquees. The dance stage will also be in the main marquee where appropriate teams will dance to entertain stallholders and visitors on Saturday and Sunday.

Concerts and Folk Clubs: Concerts featuring

festival guests start on Thursday evening and continue throughout the weekend. This year's main concert venue is the Tenterden Club. with smaller events



in The Saddlery at The White Lion and The Yardarm Folk Orchestra in their usual slot at St. Mildred's Church on Sunday afternoon.

The Cinque Ports Sea Songs and Shanties Session and other events will be held at the Old Dairy Tap Room. Check the map to locate all the festival venues.

**Song and music sessions:** The numerous informal and friendly sing-a-rounds and song and music sessions are, for many, one of the highlights of the festival. These sessions take place every day in various venues so there is sure to be one that suits your taste or mood. This year we also have a session of mainly lrish, Scottish and other Celtic music. You can come along to the sessions and enjoy the music even if you do not want to sing or play.

**Workshops and meet the guest sessions:** Some of the festival workshops and meet the guest sessions offer you the opportunity to participate, ask a few questions, learn a tune or song, brush up a skill, or hear an expert talk on a particular topic. Check out the diary section for full details.

**Venues and public houses:** Venues include the Recreation Ground, the High Street, the Tenterden Club, St Mildred's Church, and Church Hall and Old Dairy Tap Room. Events also take place in This Ancient Boro, the Vine Inn, White Lion Saddlery, Woolpack barn, possibly the Print House (formerly the William Caxton), and may be one or two other town centre venues.

# Events and Artists of Particular Interest

### The Thursday evening concert:

This year's Thursday evening concert is The Around Kent Folk Concert featuring four well known guests based in Kent, performing songs and tunes collected or written in Kent, or having a connection with Kent. The guests are **Bob Kenward, John & Di Cullen, Julie & Gavin Atkin** and **Sue Watson**. The venue is the Tenterden Club and doors open at 7.00 p.m. for a 7.30 start. Full Weekend Tickets do not cover this event. Tickets from £15. A stair lift is available if needed.

### The English barn dance (Friday evening):

The English barn dance is a regular and popular feature of the festival. This year's barn dance band will be the amazing **Catsfield Steamers**.

**Cinque Ports Sea Songs and Shanties Session:** This annual event late on Saturday afternoon is always very popular. To make better use of the available venues, we have relocated it to The Old Dairy Tap Room. This is a large hall with a real ale bar. Despite steps at the front disabled access is available.

**Squeezebox Showcase:** This regular event gives festival guests a chance to demonstrate the different boxes they play with some tunes, songs and chat and to answer your questions.

# Where Lankin crept in A Tenterden Folk festival Fringe event on Zoom on Friday 26th October:

Singer and storyteller, Pete Castle, presents a slightly different twist on Halloween. Pete was a regular guest at the festival for the first 25 years, but caring duties have prevented him from coming down from Derbyshire for the past few years.

**Ken Wilson:** If you have ever seen or heard The Wilson Family you will know Ken, but you have probably never seen him solo so here is your chance.

**The Ashen Keys:** a multi instrumental, multi voiced celebration of heartfelt storytelling from Kent. Their sound tells of influences from folk, blues, pop, classical and even early music. Expect to be taken on a journey through dark folk tales, bittersweet love stories and reveries on nature, all with exquisite vocal harmonies and unique instrumentation.

**The Catsfield Steamers:** They have played British traditional music, for social dance all over the country since the mid-1970's. The melody and harmonies are provided by accordion, banjo, fiddle, mandola, mandolin, melodeon and saxophone, backed by driving rhythms from guitar, bass and drums.

The James Kerry Trio: James has played at



Tenterden several times with his band Foot Down. For the trio he is joined by Tom Kitching and Danny Tonks.

**Tamise:** A five piece youth band based in London and Oxford.


